5.5 Community Park

Delivery of Community Park

2020/21 has proven to be challenging with the onset of COVID-19 and the constraints it imposed upon conventional funding windows.

With the return to previous funding streams, the Shire will be revisiting its grant application and will be resubmitting to LotteryWest in July 2021.

Outcome of submission is anticipated to be in September / October 2021.

If proven successful, the Shire will proceed to delivery of the project commencing in February / March 2022.

5.6 Old School Site

Nyoongar representatives on the Old School Site Working Group – Mrs Margaret Collard and Mrs Winnie Henry.

The Landscape/Heritage Architect has been reengaged to revise the Concept Plan drawings and plans which can then be costed more carefully to an approximate budget of \$93,000.

Grant Funding is still to be applied for.

Construction is not anticipated to begin prior to July 2022.
