Road Safety Commission Grants

Amount: Up to \$1000

Due Date: December 2018

About: There are two types of grants offered by the Road Safety commission: Project Grants and Event grants.

Project grants: The Road Safety Community Grant Program supports the development and implementation of sustainable projects and one-off community activities related to road safety. **Project Grants:** Project grants are available for groups to submit an application to implement road safety projects. These projects can run up to 12 months and should comprise of road safety activities that can be sustained after the funding period.

Event Grants: Event grants are available for groups to submit an application to implement road safety activities and promotions at a community attended event.

Community Sporting & Recreation Facilities Fund

Amount: \$2,500 to \$2 mill. Approved grant will be no greater than one-third of the total estimated project cost.
