### CBH Grass Roots Funding

Community groups and organisations are able to seek financial assistance for events and projects which contribute to the health and vitality of their community.

Grants of up to \$5,000 are available for community related events and up to \$20,000 for small scale infrastructure projects.

Applications **open 1 March** and **1 August** each year.

### Community Engagement Grants - Culture & Arts (WA)

Provides funding for arts-based activities that promote the participation and engagement of WA communities in arts and culture.

Grants are available for a range of activities that will deliver on one or more of the following objectives:

- promoting or facilitating greater engagement of WA communities in arts and culture;
- delivering artistic, cultural and social outcomes for the community through the arts;
- providing opportunities for communities to create and share their stories;
- encouraging communities to engage with and express their culture; and/or
- increasing the relevance and accessibility of arts and culture within communities.

2 categories - projects up to \$15,000; projects more than \$15,000 (funding capped at \$40,000). Funding for up to 80% of the project expenses (20% from other sources).

Applications are open year round for the under \$15,000 category. Applications for the over \$15,000 category close **22 March 2019**.

### Active Regional Communities Grants

This program aims to increase the opportunities for regional people to participate in sporting and active recreational activities in regional WA (up to \$5000). Funding can be used for:

- Coaching clinics
- Volunteer training
- Project or program administration (no more than 10% of total funding)
- Coaching accreditation courses
- Referee or umpire accreditation courses
- Equipment (approved, integral to the project or program, remains the property of the organisation and funded up to 30%).

Applications are **accepted throughout the year** but must be lodged at least six weeks prior to your start date.

### CSRFF Grants - Sport & Rec

Provides State Government financial assistance to community groups and local government authorities to develop basic infrastructure for sport and recreation.

Three streams of funding include Small Grants (up to \$66,000), Annual Grants (up to \$166,000) and Forward Planning Grants (Up to \$2,000,000).

The type of projects which will be considered for funding include change rooms and ablutions, clubrooms, floodlighting projects, new playing surfaces—ovals, courts synthetic surfaces etc, resurfacing of existing sports surfaces and sports storage

Applications close **29 March 2019**.

## Sporting Schools Grants

Sporting Schools programs for primary and secondary schools are designed to have a positive influence on lifelong participation trends for sport and physical activity. Australian schools can apply. Funding amounts are usually between \$1,300 and \$3,100 per term. That includes a base amount determined by your whole school enrolment, plus an amount for your expected overall participant numbers. Special Circumstances funding is also available to assist schools with additional costs due to location or demographics.

## Mercy Foundation - Social Justice Small Grants

Seeks to provide seed funding to assist communities and organisations to build capacity that will help create structural change and bring about greater social justice in Australia. The Mercy Foundation seeks to create greater social equity and inclusion in the Australian community. Grant amounts range from \$1,000 to \$10,000.

The focus for 2019 is *Justice and our Environment*.

This includes issues such as:

- Protection and conservation of water or wider environment
- Minimising waste
- Care for wildlife especially threatened species
- Minimizing future environmental damage
- Addressing depleting resources
- Clean and renewable energy

## Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR) - Small & Vital Grants

The Strengthening Rural Communities (SRC) program aims to give the thousands of small rural, regional and remote communities across Australia an opportunity to apply for funding that can support broad community needs. Deliberately flexible, this program can provide funds of up to \$10,000. Applications are accepted year round via our online application system and awarded quarterly.

The Strengthening Rural Communities program funds a wide range of projects such as:

- Repair and maintenance of infrastructure, such as public halls, preschools and recreation reserves.

- Providing communications equipment and enhancing infrastructure and systems, especially for emergency services organisations.
- Community events and capacity building, such as volunteer training, support and development.

Applications close **26 March 2019**.

## JetStar Flying Start Program

Tell Jetstar about a project which helps enhance the lives of people in your local community and you could receive a \$30,000 grant. Groups can support the community with health, education, charity, sport and the arts.

The grant includes:

- \$15,000 Cash
- \$15,000 worth of travel with Jetstar anywhere on the Jetstar network
- Promotion of their community group or organisation on Jetstar's promotions network

Applications can be submitted twice per year. Next round closes **31 March 2019**

## Country Arts WA - Project Fund

Funding can cover artist, arts worker and cultural adviser fees, travel, accommodation, materials, venue, equipment hire and insurance. Activity in all art forms including visual arts, theatre, dance, creative writing, music, multi-media and cultural projects including recording and preservation of language & stories are eligible. Priority will be given to projects that increase employment opportunities for, and raise of the profile of, regional artists and/or communities.

1. **Individual – Up to \$15,000.** This is available to individual artists or arts workers from regional and remote Western Australia.
2. **Community – Up to \$30,000.** This is available to not-for-profit organisations or local governments from regional and remote Western Australia

Applications close **Friday 15 March 2019**.

## Creativity Australia - One Voice Community Choir Grant

The purpose of this grant is to enable individuals and community groups to develop sustainable With One Voice Social Franchises through establishing a community choir. Grants are valued at \$10,000 and only 10 of these grants are available. They will be awarded on a first come, first served basis and must be awarded before **30 June 2019**.

## Road Safety Commission - Events Grants

To further encourage community groups to participate in road safety, the Road Safety Community Grant Program provides from \$50 to \$1000 in event grants.

Below are some examples of road safety supporting policies that could be included in your application for a sponsorship grant:

- **Drink driving:**
  - Implementation of a responsible service of alcohol policy
  - Serve only low strength alcohol
  - Free water available
  - Food available
  - Provision for participants to stay overnight (i.e. camping areas).
- **Fatigue:**
  - Event finishes at a reasonable time (i.e. before midnight)
  - Provision for participants to stay overnight (i.e. camping areas)
- **Safer Vehicles:**
  - Implementation of a workplace road safety policy. There are resources and information available on the Road Safety Commission website
  - Promote the selection of ANCAP ratings and 5 star crash safety ratings of vehicles.

Applications must be received at least three months prior to the event and are assessed monthly.

**Applications close on the last Friday of every month.**

## Social Enterprise Development and Investment Funds

This funding improves access to finance and support for social enterprises to help them grow their business and increase the impact of their work in their communities.

Social enterprises can be found in both the for-profit and not-for-profit sectors and come in a variety of forms such as independent businesses, co-operatives, community enterprise, social businesses and the trading arms of charities.

**Ongoing funding** is available by contacting the fund managers to discuss the nature of your project or loan.

## WA Golf Foundation

Designed to assist the development of golf within Western Australia. Grants are anticipated to be under \$5000 and can target junior development, adult development and specified groups. Previously there has been little emphasis placed on development programmes for adults. However with the challenges that golf faces in competing with other sports, an increasing focus of the Foundation will be to provide funding for programmes that target adults who have not played the game before.

## St John's Heart Grant

Thanks to [Lotterywest](#), St John WA is opening expressions of interest to not-for-profit organisations for the Heart Grant; approximately 1000 defibrillators to be located for public community use, for just \$200, normally retailing in excess of \$2000. This includes the defibrillator unit, a lock box and necessary first aid training.

Expressions of interest for this grant are welcome from not-for-profit WA sporting and community groups.
